The U.S. Constitution requires a national census once every 10 years. The census is a count of everyone residing in the United States. It shows state population counts and determines representation in the U.S. House of Representatives. Funding for critical community services and the location of schools, hospitals, senior centers and other facilities all depend on accurate census data. The U.S. Constitution requires a national census once every 10 years. All U.S. residents must be counted – people of all races and ethnic groups, both citizens and non-citizens. By law, the Census Bureau cannot share an individual's census questionnaire responses with anyone, including other federal agencies and law enforcement entities such as the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) or the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement agency.
