Governor Tom Corbett signed the omnibus school code bill passed by the Senate and House. The state public education appropriation is \$5.35 billion, which represents a 4.56% increase from the 2010-2011 budget. The federal stimulus appropriations (ARRA funds) are \$0, which is a 10% to 15% decrease in total education spending from the 2010-2011 budget.

Other core public education programs such as Special Education, Early Intervention, Career and Technical Education, and Pupil Transportation, are funded at or close to the 2010-11 appropriation levels. Accountability Grants were defunded and the Pre-K Counts program received a decrease of 2.88%.

The EITC program received \$75 million, which is a 25% increase from last year's allocation. The EITC family income level will also increase to \$60 thousand with \$12 thousand a dependent and SOs will have a week delay again this year. All SOs can file their application on July 8, 2011. The EITC also went back to the prior year's funding levels, so nonpublic line items received 2/3 and EIO's received 1/3 of the available revenues. Please feel free to contact me with any questions.
